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SYNOPSIS - 1 LINE

A talented young blind hip hop dancer is sexually assaulted by her choreographer in the days leading up to the biggest performance of her career.

SYNOPSIS - 3 LINE

A story about Tanisha, a blind and extremely talented hip hop dancer, who we find is being sexually assaulted by her choreographer in the days leading up to the biggest performance of her career. She must overcome her inability and fear to talk about what is happening to her as the story progresses and make a decision whether or not she will perform.

STATEMENT FROM THE DIRECTOR

Personally, "Lifeline" had an immense significance to me.

The story is inspired by a dancer friend of mine that was sexually assaulted (not by her choreographer, however). She dared to tell me about it and talk about how the assault had the power to seep into everyday moments in someone's life and stain the very fabric of someone's joy. I thought about that for a long time and decided to write about it, with the hopes of carrying that theme (amongst others) to whoever watched it. I also wanted to send my friend a message. That message is that it is up to her and only her, to step out of the shadow of what happened in the past and have that same courage to move forward and enjoy life and its moments, not for anything or anyone else, but herself.

In that same time, I reconnected with Tanisha, a friend I hadn't seen since elementary school, who now happened to be a professional dancer in Los Angeles for some of the biggest studios and choreographers in the industry. The timing, being as insane as it was was the first step towards making the project happen. I pitched her the story - she was on board. Lifeline marked her first time stepping off the dance floor and in front of a camera as a character. The rest of the cast, Claire, Rachel, Nathan, Aion, were all fantastic to collaborate with; some in the form of purely voiceover, others on set, but all talented.

I can't forget to mention how valuable the amount of time, reworks of script drafts, and secondary pair of eyes my partner in crime, Jared was to me. We work together, and his opinions on this project were pivotal. As I relentlessly wrote version after version, ending after ending, edited for hours in Adobe, sound mixed in audacity, foley in our apartment with my phone and a Rode Mic, Jared was alongside me, offering advice, critique, encouragement, whatever was needed. All of the others on our small student crew were fantastic, Ashton, Cortlin, Scott, Alec, each having what felt like was a shining moment during production. It was overall an unbelievable experience.

Having shot the film almost entirely upon Jared and my combined gear set with a budget comprised of my lunch money from other side gigs, I am stoked to have you watch the film. Lifeline, at its core, is a story inspired by a close friend's experience, written with patience, produced with love, edited with passion, and created to provoke change.




Bryant Hyun - Director, Director of Photography, Editor, Sound Designer, Colorist, Writer.


Alec Salerno - Camera Op

Scott Graves - Camera Op


